Immigration Study

January 22, 2008 7:00 - 9:00 p.m. Leesburg Airport Conference Room

The LWV US has reached the member agreement phase of the LWVUS Immigration Study and has asked all local Leagues to take consensus. The resulting position will allow LWV to affect national policy for years to come. The Immigration Study will include:

- the underlying values and principles regarding immigration
- reasons for immigration
- current federal immigration policy and
- the impact of immigration.

LWV Loudoun County will take consensus on January 22 and submit its Consensus to LWVUS by February 1, 2008. The LWVUS will adopt a position by April 2008.

What is Consensus?

Consensus is the process League uses to reach member agreement on a study issue. It is neither a simple majority nor unanimity; it is an overall sense of the group. Consensus results from answers to questions on which members can find common ground and agreement. Group discussion that allows an exchange of ideas and opinions is the preferred way to achieve consensus, although questionnaires and email polls are acceptable.
